#### Yavapai County 4-H/FFA EXPO

#### **General Rules and Regulations**

#### **Exhibitor Qualifications**

All members who are enrolled and in good standing in the current 4-H or FFA year, and are currently enrolled in a 4-H club **OR** Agricultural Education class or state approved Middle School "Discovery" Program and are under the supervision and instruction of a 4-H leader or Agri-Ed Instructor, and meet the following requirements, are eligible to participate in the Yavapai County 4-H/FFA EXPO.

#### **Exhibitor Divisions**

- > **JUNIOR MEMBERS** are those who have reached their 9<sup>th</sup>, but not their 13<sup>th</sup> birthday prior to January 1 of the club year.
- > **SENIOR MEMBERS** are those who have reached their 14<sup>th</sup>, but not their 19<sup>th</sup> birthday prior to January 1 of the club year.
- **NOVICE MEMBERS** are those members of any age that have not previously shown any small or large livestock.

#### **4-H Youth Development Program**

- ➤ Clover buds 5 8 years old prior to Jan 1 of the current club year
- ➤ 4-H Club 9 18 years old prior to Jan 1 of the current club year

All members are expected to participate in EXPO by assisting with set-up and take down, throughout the week.

#### **FFA**

FFA members may exhibit at the Yavapai County 4-H/FFA EXPO through their senior year of high school.

All members are expected to participate in EXPO by assisting with set-up and/or take down, and/or throughout the week

#### Youth Livestock Quality Assurance (YLQA)

All 4-H and FFA members entering Market Livestock and Market Small Stock (Beef, Dairy, Goats, Sheep, Swine, Rabbits, Poultry, Waterfowl, and Eggs) at the Yavapai County 4-H/FFA EXPO Show & Sale **MUST** have completed Youth Livestock Quality Assurance AND Food Safety Training conducted by certified personnel. *This certification is valid for three years*. All leaders/advisors must also be certified in order to be eligible to sign entry forms. Date(s) of available trainings will be published in the Clover Communicator or call the Yavapai Extension office at (928) 445-6590 ext. 229, for more information.

#### **Special Accommodations**

Persons with a disability may request reasonable accommodation by contacting the Cooperative Extension Office. Requests should be made as early as possible to allow time to arrange for the accommodation.

#### **Exhibitor Dress**

All exhibitors must present themselves in appropriate and professional dress according to these guidelines:

#### Showmanship & Conformation (Large & Small Livestock, Dog)

- ➤ 4-H members must wear appropriate clothing: a long-sleeve white or kelly green (4-H Green) shirt with collar and full-front button-up with shirt tails tucked in; clean, neat (not faded), black or blue jeans/slacks/gauchos; Ties or scarves (some type of neckwear Green or White opposite Color of the Shirt). No hats may be worn. Closed-toed shoes that stress safety are required.
- > **FFA** members must wear appropriate official dress, as defined by the official FFA Manual. Closed-toed shoes that stress safety are required.

#### Dairy:

Exhibitors both 4-H and FFA are expected to wear "Show Whites" (White button-up long sleeve shirt, white pants, green 4-H tie or approved FFA dairy attire). Closed-toed shoes that stress safety are required.

#### Auction:

- 4-H Exhibitors are expected to wear appropriate clothing: a long-sleeved shirt with collar and full-front button-up with shirt tails tucked in; Clean, neat (not faded), black or blue jeans/slacks/gauchos; Belts, ties or scarves.
  Official 4-H vests, official 4-H hats, and cowboy hats may be worn, but are optional. Closed-toed shoes that stress safety are required.
- > FFA Exhibitors must wear appropriate official dress, as defined by the official FFA Manual. Closed-toed shoes that stress safety are required.
- NO DECORATING OF ANIMALS OF ANY KIND!

#### NOTE:

A superintendent may dismiss or restrict an exhibitor from the class or sale for inappropriate attire including, but not limited to, any wording promoting drugs, alcohol, & profanity. Check with your superintendent in advance if you have any questions regarding your attire.

#### **Entry Requirements**

- 1. Upon receipt of entries, the EXPO show/sale Secretary will email a list of the entries to the Community Club Leaders / FFA advisors to approve the entries. Upon receipt of leader approval, the entries will be accepted.
- Entries are to be submitted online with ShoWorks at www.4HFFAEXPO.com 2 weeks prior to tagging. These
  are to be used for each department and/or species in which the exhibitor participates. Go to www.4hffaexpo.com for
  specific information. Entry Fees must be submitted at tagging. No entries will be accepted without Entry Fees and
  ENTIRELY COMPLETE online information. See ShoWorks at www.4HFFAEXPO.com invoice for applicable
  Entry Fees. (Fees cannot be paid online)
- 3. Entries must represent the project work of the 4-H or FFA member for which they are enrolled, and not have been previously exhibited at EXPO (except breeding stock). Exhibitors may enter only in the class which corresponds to the projects currently enrolled. You, Exhibitors, may not show another Exhibitor's animal unless the Superintendents designate otherwise.
- 4. Seasonal Passes / Premise I.D.'s All exhibitors are required to be in full compliance with the Arizona Department of Agriculture (AZDA) regulations regarding Seasonal Passes. The requirements and instruction on how to obtain a Seasonal Pass are available with the Arizona Department of Agriculture. Seasonal Passes will be checked at ear tagging, and all other EXPO events. Please note that all SHEEP, GOATS, and SWINE must have Official Identification tags (which require that the seller/breeder have a premises identification number). SWINE ARE INCLUDED IN THIS RULE- GO TO THIS WEBSITE. https://agriculture.az.gov/seasonal-pass-application
- 5. **Photo of Exhibitors** Three photos (4" x 6" maximum size) of EACH animal must be included with the entry form. Photos must clearly show the left side, right side, and face of the animal. At least one photo must include the face of the exhibitor. Side photos must show the full side of the body, including hooves. Please write exhibitor's name, club, and scrapie ID tag number on the back of each photo.
- 6. **Code of Conduct- All** participants will adhere to and sign the **Yavapai County 4-H/FFA EXPO Code of Conduct** form, a copy of which will be kept on file at the Cooperative Extension office. 4-H/FFA members, leaders, or parents who fail to abide by all listed stipulations will be asked to leave the grounds and will forfeit all awards, premiums, or auction proceeds and will be barred from participating in the following Yavapai County 4-H/FFA EXPO.
- 7. The Yavapai County 4-H/FFA EXPO Committee (hereafter COMMITTEE) reserves the right to interpret these rules and settle and determine all matters and/or questions which may arise in regard to any situation connected with or incidental to EXPO and not in conflict with University of Arizona Policy. In a time sensitive situation the Executive Board has the authority to make decisions for the Committee.
- 8. Exhibitors are cautioned to keep equipment stored where it will not be lost or stolen. The COMMITTEE is not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged items or equipment.
- Any and all exhibits not claimed by 4:00pm on Sunday will be disposed of by the Extension office at the discretion of the COMMITTEE.
- 10. <u>No exhibitor is allowed to stay overnight at the Rodeo Grounds without direct adult supervision</u>. Only exhibitors who are staying overnight under the supervision of Parents, Guardians, FFA Advisors or Certified 4-H Leaders will be allowed. Anyone found in violation of this rule will be subject to expulsion from the show.
- 11. Per the Prescott Frontier Days Rodeo, anyone wishing to camp overnight and use the water and/or electrical hookups will be required to pay approximately \$50.00 for the week of EXPO. Reservations for camp spots should be submitted to the extension office with a check made payable to "Prescott Frontier Days Rodeo". Additional sites through the 4-H/FFA EXPO are available without water and electricity and require a \$25.00 flat fee, payable to "4-H/FFA EXPO." Spots will be reserved first come first served basis. No blank spots will be able to be reserved without payment.
- 12. For the safety of the animals and the exhibitors, **NO Dogs, Bikes, Rollerblades, Skateboards, Razors, etc. in Barns, Tents or Main Livestock Show Arena** including the bleachers. Please respect this rule for the safety of all. Seeing eye dogs for the sight impaired are an exception to this rule.
- 13. The use and operation of motorized equipment, i.e. Forklift, ATVs, etc. Will be restricted to individuals approved through the EXPO FACILITIES committee.
- 14. ALL EXPO EHIBITORS will pay a \$25.00 clean-up fee(\*one fee per participant) In efforts to get more help with tear-down this fee will NOT be reimbursed unless a minimum of 4 hours of tear-down hours are met.

#### Superintendents

- 1. It is the responsibility of the superintendent(s) of each department to inform the judge(s) of specific departmental rules and regulations concerning the issuing of awards.
- 2. It is the responsibility of the superintendent(s) of each department to see that all awards are properly entered and distributed.
- 3. Under authority from the COMMITTEE, each superintendent will have the final right of determination as to the disposal of exhibits not claimed by the exhibitor. (INDOOR EXHIBITS)
- 4. A superintendent may, under the direction of EXPO Executive Board, may reserve the right to reject or dismiss any entry he or she feels is unworthy of competition, or poses a health or safety threat to any persons, property, or livestock. Under direction of executive board.
- 5. **All** superintendents are to be afforded the respect to which they are entitled. **Any** superintendent, WHETHER OR NOT THEY ARE DIRECTLY AFFILIATED WITH A PARTICULAR DEPARTMENT, has authority to enforce **all** rules at such time as they see fit.

#### **Judges & Judging**

- 1. Judges are responsible for reading and understanding all general and special rules within each department, division, or class in which they are to serve.
- 2. All evaluations are initially made based on the Danish System of judging. As EXPO is a learning event, at no time will a judge fail to bestow an award. All comments to exhibitors should be made in as constructive a manner as possible.
- 3. Judges shall report to the superintendent any exhibitor, leader, parent, or other person who in any way interferes or shows disrespect toward them during or after adjudication of a class. The superintendent will have the option of demanding a formal apology from the offender directly to the judge and/or excluding the exhibitor or offending person from further participation in EXPO.
- 4. The decision of the judge shall be final except in the event of fraud or misrepresentation, not discovered at the time of award. In cases of fraud or misrepresentation, the offending exhibit will be removed from competition and all lower placements will advance one award if the award was based on the American System of judging. Additional implications are noted in *Code of Conduct*.
- 5. Grand and Reserve Champion and Yavapai Bred & Fed awards will only be awarded if the exhibitor and/or animal have received a BLUE ribbon. Additionally, the following guidelines will apply:
  - > All entries will be judged on the Danish System of awards. Entries may be placed in blue, red, or white ribbon categories.
  - For Showmanship only, there is no requirement on the minimum number of entries per class or species required for the awarding of Grand or Reserve Champion awards.
  - For Conformation classes, the Grand and Reserve Champion awards will be given (at the established prize levels) when there are 3 or more ENTRIES in a class. If there are 2 or fewer ENTRIES in a class, the Grand and Reserve Champion awards will be given, however they will be at a reduced prize level.
- 6. The showmanship contest will be judged on the exhibitor's ability to show his/her animal to its advantage and his/her knowledge in handling, fitting and selecting animals for production and show. The judge may also ask questions pertaining to the project. Separate classes will be held for judging novice, junior, and senior showmanship.

#### **Livestock: General Rules**

All Exhibitors, Parents, Leaders, Advisors and Agents will abide by the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, National Code of Show Ring Ethics.

#### **EXHIBITORS**

- 1. Exhibitors of livestock must keep their area of the barn (including small stock that remains for the duration of EXPO), neat and clean. All litter is to be disposed of in appropriate areas designated for that purpose.
- 2. Every effort will be made to protect and care for entries, but in no case will the EXPO Committee, including the officers, superintendents and other volunteers be responsible for any damage or loss which may occur. Each exhibitor must furnish his or her own food and water equipment. All exhibits will be cared for during the hours of EXPO. If extra care is needed contact the appropriate Superintendent.
- 3. Exhibitors must FIT and SHOW their own animals with help from other members from Yavapai County, junior leaders and teen leaders only. IMPORTANT! Parents and leaders are reminded that all work pertaining to cleanliness of stall/pen areas and to the educational exhibits must be done by the club members. The educational value of such activities is lost if members are not allowed to be responsible for their part in the activities. Exhibitors may be disqualified from a Showmanship Event if this rule is violated, excluding situations that are deemed to be unsafe.
- 4. Exhibitors may only use appliances (clippers, blowers, heaters, fans, etc.), which are properly grounded and meet UL specifications.
- 5. In order to keep the show moving on time and for the safety of all exhibitors and their animals, we will be enforcing a clean aisle policy 15 minutes prior to the start of a respective show animal's show hours until the end of the show. All items found in the aisles will be gathered up and placed in the designated "Lost and Found" area of the barn/tent.
- 6. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that their animal(s) are properly fed and watered each day.
- 7. All exhibitors are required to thoroughly clean their stall/pen area before being permitted to checkout. This includes market animals sold at auction.

#### **EXHIBITS**

All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor or under an approved lease agreement.

#### MARKET DIVISION ENTRIES MAY NOT BE LEASED.

- 1. Exhibitor must use the market animal for showmanship, if the exhibitor does not have a market animal entered in that species they may use a prospect or breeding animal that is entered. Breeding animals <u>may not</u> be a mature male breeding animal, sow or gilt over 8 months old. All breeding, market, prospect and feeding will compete in one showmanship class by age of the exhibitor. With the exception of Small Stock
- 2. Exhibitors of breeding and/or small stock may be asked to show proof of ownership.
- 3. Large market livestock exhibitors will be permitted to tag up to four animals per species, but may exhibit only two.
- 4. Exhibitors wishing to sell in the auction must participate in BOTH **conformation and showmanship** class for that species.
- 5. Yavapai County 4-H/FFA EXPO tags will be the official tags for the show and will correspond with the exhibitor numbers. Notify a department superintendent immediately if an animal loses its tag or it becomes unreadable.
- 6. Animals must be kept in pens provided or in their tie stalls. In extenuating circumstances, speak to the superintendent if any exceptions need to be made.
- 7. Exhibitors are required to provide their own bedding.
- 8. Release information: All remaining livestock will be released Sunday, between 4:00pm to 6:00pm.
- 9. Animals will be placed in classes after weighing on the official scale at check-in.

#### WEIGH-IN

- Each market animal and/or meat pen will be weighed-in from 9:00am 4:00pm on designated day. See EXPO Dates and Deadlines.
- 2. Large stock market entries, which don't make minimum weight as specified in their market division, will be automatically entered in the feeder division for that species. **Though ineligible for auction, feeder animals are eligible for showmanship classes.**
- 3. In disputed cases, exhibitors may request a re-weigh, provided the animal has not left the scale area. NO WET ANIMALS OR UNSHORN LAMBS WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE SCALES.
- 4. Members are responsible for calculating shrinkage on their market animals.

#### **VET CHECK**

- 1. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to disclose all concerns.
- 2. After check in all health concerns are to be addressed by the show veterinarian and superintendent. (Grounds for Dismissal)

#### **HEALTH RULES**

- 1. All animals must be in good health and condition to be entered into EXPO. Visibly sick animals or those showing signs of active internal or external parasites or fungal infections WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ENTER THE SHOW GROUNDS. Market animals that, in the opinion of the Sifting Committee, show evidence of poor physical condition. Per the Sifting Committee, WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO SELL, BUT MAY BE ALLOWED TO COMPETE IN SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES. In questionable cases, exhibitor may be asked to obtain a licensed veterinarian's written statement as to the health status of the animal.
- 2. The USDA Wholesome Meat Act applies to all animals sold for slaughter. The Act and COMMITTEE rules require the following:
  - Drug label directions must be followed including withdrawal periods.
    - (a) By signing the *Entry Form(s)* the exhibitor attests that their animal(s) will be drug free at weigh-in, and will remain so until such time as it is released for slaughter. Please see Rule 16 & 17 under Auction Rules for further clarification.
    - (b) If it shall become necessary to administer medication to an animal while on EXPO grounds, it must be done by a licensed veterinarian and reported immediately to the superintendent(s) in charge. If withdrawal period exceeds projected slaughter date, exhibitor must take animal home and care for it until such time as it is safe and legal to slaughter for human consumption.

#### All Market Animals Are PROHIBITED from Being Dipped.

- Exhibitors whose exhibition animal is slaughtered, and the carcass is condemned for drug or chemical residues, will forfeit all class, sale, and premium monies and/or awards, and may be subject to criminal investigation and/or charges. In addition, exhibitors found guilty of violating this rule, will be prohibited from participation at any future EXPO and/or any other livestock exhibition.
- 3. <u>Swine Health Requirements:</u> All animals must be identified with an Arizona Department of Agriculture Premises I.D. Number either permanently tattooed or affixed by the means of a tamper-proof ear tag. They must present a Seasonal pass: for more information, go to the website <a href="https://agriculture.az.gov/seasonal-pass-application">https://agriculture.az.gov/seasonal-pass-application</a>.

#### NO SWINE WILL BE PERMITTED TO UNLOAD WITHOUT MEETING THE ABOVE REQUIREMENT!!!

#### **CLASSIFICATION**

- 1. Animals do not need to be registered or pure bred to enter in EXPO
- 2. Exhibitors should check with their project leader/advisor or other knowledgeable person as to the correct breed classification to which their entry belongs.
  - a. If members or leaders need help, call the Cooperative Extension Office 928-445-6590 ext 229

#### **Protests & Appeals**

- NO PROTEST OR APPEAL BASED UPON CHARGES OF INCOMPETENCY OF THE JUDGE WILL BE CONSIDERED.
- 2. All protests must be submitted in writing with payment within 5 hours after the decision has been made to a member of the EXPO Executive Board. The EXPO Executive Board provided such protest is accompanied by a \$50.00 fee if the protest is lodged by a 4-H or FFA member. A \$100.00 fee will be charged if any non-member lodges the protest.
- 3. Protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal, with specific charges and recital of the facts relied upon or the rule violated, naming witnesses and their addresses by which proofs are to be made. No protests of weights will be allowed.
- 4. If the protest thus lodged is found to be valid by a majority of the Executive Committee (or in the case of a complaint lodged against the Executive Committee, a majority of The Committee members present), the fee/deposit shall be returned to the person or persons lodging the protest. If the protest thus lodged is found to be invalid, said fee shall be forfeited by the person or persons lodging the protest and shall become the property of The Committee.

#### **Hardship Clause**

In the event that a 4-H or FFA member's project animal dies or is severely injured prior to or during EXPO, that member may borrow an animal already ID'd and entered for showmanship purposes only. This opportunity is *experiential only* and the 4-H or FFA member may only be eligible for Danish in showmanship.

#### **Deceased Market Animals**

On occasion, members' livestock die after the ear tagging and/or market livestock registration process is completed. As they have been active in their project areas and learning throughout the project, this ruling is meant to apply to those situations where a member in good standing who has previously completed the registration process for the current year EXPO has an animal die can still enter a market entry. The following conditions must be met:

- A death certificate or statement signed by the Project Leader and the member's parent(s) certifying the death must accompany the request to enter a new animal in the place of the original animal: and
- In order to have sufficient time invested in there replacement livestock, the new animal must be purchased 90 days prior to the current EXPO dates.
- All paperwork required for a market livestock entry must be submitted (excluding previously submitted YLQA certificated). A new registration fee is also required: and a new seasonal pass will be required for species requiring seasonal pass.
- The replacement animal is examined by the EXPO Superintendent in charge of that division to ensure that it is in good health and to apply and an EXPO ear tag at that time
- NO replacement animal will be eligible for Yavapai Bred & Fed or Best Rate of Gain awards.

#### **Auction Rules**

- 1. Exhibitors may sell one large livestock, one small stock, and/or one indoor exhibit during the live auction. Market and/or breeding animals may be sold.
- 2. Large market livestock entries must have an I.D. Form on file at the Cooperative Extension office.
- 3. Exhibitors *must* participate in both conformation and showmanship for that species in order to sell through the auction.
- 4. All ribbon awards: blue, red, and white, will be permitted to sell. No private treaty or barn sales are permitted during the EXPO auction. All private treaty sales will only be allowed on Sunday of the Yavapai County Fair ONLY.
- 5. Single Sale Rule
  - The Yavapai County 4-H/FFA EXPO is conducted in accordance with policies and guidelines established by the University of Arizona. To ensure that this policy is followed in Yavapai County, the Committee will be investigating in the names of individuals who sold their animal project with the Verde Valley Fair Association (VVFA). By participating in the EXPO auction, you are agreeing with the release of your name to the VVFA. Exhibitors are required to sell all Grand or Reserve Champion market beef, lamb, swine, or market goats. If an exhibitor wins Grand and/or Reserve Champion in more than one species, then the Single Sale Rule does not apply!
- 6. SALE ORDER: Each exhibitor's highest placing blue, red, or white ribbon animal will be listed in the sale catalog unless a *Withdrawal Request* has been submitted no later than 5:00 pm Friday of EXPO. Exhibitors may substitute a lower placing entry at the same time the *Withdrawal Request* is submitted, provided all other sale rule provisions have been met. Sale order to be determined by Show and Sale Secretary and approved by the EXPO Executive Board.
- 7. **Under no circumstances** will an exhibitor whose sole sale prospect dies or becomes sick or injured to the point of being unable to show or has been otherwise termed as unfit, be allowed to sell in the Yavapai County 4-H/FFA EXPO Livestock Auction.
- 8. Market animals that are deemed ineligible for sale at the EXPO Livestock Auction, MAY BE REMOVED FROM THE EXPO GROUNDS UPON OBTAINING A RELEASE FROM THE APPROPRIATE SUPERINTENDENT under the direction of the EXPO Executive Board.
- 9. The Yavapai County 4-H/FFA EXPO does not guarantee the sale of any animal. Every effort will be made to market each animal while in the auction ring.
- 10. Animals are NOT to be costumed or decorated in any way. Only approved animal show products may be used. Any animal that is determined to not be in a clean condition will be refused entry until it has been properly cleaned. Upon being properly cleaned, every attempt will be made to market the animal at the next opening after having been represented to the ring gate keeper. If the last animal has been marketed prior to your returning with your livestock being in a clean condition, you will have forfeited your opportunity to have your animal sold at auction.
- 11. A 7% commission will be deducted from the total proceeds, including add-ons, of each animal.
- 12. **Premiums from the Sale of Livestock at County Fairs:** Livestock shows and sales are a historic part of the 4-H experience. Young people who have raised animals through their 4-H projects often sell these animals at public auctions. The money the youth receive from such sales is often in excess of fair market value because members of the community typically wish to reward and recognize the efforts of young people who raise these animals within an educational setting. In return, the public expects to receive a wholesome product and recognition for their purchase.
  - Individuals who purchase an animal are responsible to consult their tax advisor to determine if they may deduct the amount paid in excess of the market sale value.
  - Individual 4-H & FFA members who benefit from extra income (often called a premium) from the sale of livestock at public auctions are responsible for reporting this extra income to the IRS. You will receive a 1099 for the amount of the auction.

- 13. It is your responsibility to thank your buyer for purchasing your animal. The annual support of the buyers makes the EXPO a success. Taking the time to thank your buyer is an important part of the process. The ways of thanking them are as varied as the exhibitors. Some suggestions of ways to show your gratitude include: a gift given at the EXPO; a hand-written thank you note; personally thanking your buyer at the auction or their place of business; a luncheon. Choose whatever way you feel most comfortable with and best express your personality but, choose a way. The EXPO Committee expects 4-H leaders and FFA advisors to ensure that their exhibitors have thanked their buyers prior to issuing them their check. Every effort will be made to have checks available for distribution within 45 days of the auction. However, checks will only be distributed once adequate funds have been collected from the buyers.
- 14. ALL exhibitors must show their own animal during the auction. Any exceptions must be approved by Executive Committee. Anyone in violation of this policy will be banned from the sale ring and forfeit their right to sell at the auction.
- 15. Any medication given for the health of the animal to treat a disease or infection within 30 days prior to being received at the fair must be declared to the Extension Office within 10 days of the first dose of medication. An animal must be healthy upon arrival and weigh-in at EXPO and be accompanied by a clean bill of health by a licensed veterinarian.
- 16. Treated animals may be shown and sold through the auction but sale of the animal does not become final until all medication withdrawal periods have been met. The member will continue to care for and own the animal at their expense until sale is final and is properly delivered to the buyer. Failure to care for animal will cancel sale and forfeit all sale monies. The owner will still pay designated auction fee. Full disclosure of the medication and the withdrawal period will be announced at the auction and buyer will sign a disclosure statement stating they understand the condition of the sale.

#### **EXPO 'Resale' Terms & Conditions**


- 1. The Yavapai County 4-H/FFA EXPO Auction Committee will be responsible for all large market resales. Small stock are not eligible for resale. *Note: Small Stock sellers should be prepared to take their animals' home in the event their buyer does not wish to take possession of the animal.*
- 2. All animals designated for resale by the original buyer are subject to purchase on a "first come, first served basis," however preferential status will be given to EXPO Committee members, show officials, and Extension personnel regarding the purchase of resale animals. Resale orders will be taken beginning at 9:00 am on the Saturday of the auction.
- 3. A \$100.00 handling fee per animal is required for any group or individual wishing to purchase one or more resale animals. The entire purchase price will consist of the \$100.00 handling fee, plus current market price.
- 4. All handling fees are due at time of registration. Full amount (current market price x weight of animal) is due by 5:00pm, on the Saturday of the auction.
- 5. If animals are unavailable, all handling fees paid will be promptly refunded.
- 6. At no time may EXPO officials, Committee members, Extension personnel, 4-H or FFA leaders or members 'trade out' or switch animals whose disposition has been lawfully designated by the original buyer.
- 7. EXPO officials, Committee members, Extension personnel, 4-H or FFA leaders, advisors, or members who attempt to convince or coerce buyers to amend their original bid or otherwise adjust the original disposition of their (the buyer's animal), are guilty of unethical behavior. Such unethical behavior will be grounds for expulsion from EXPO, forfeiture of auction proceeds and/or awards and premium monies. The offending person shall be barred from participation in any future EXPO Event.

#### NATIONAL SHOW RING CODE OF ETHICS

- 1) All exhibitors must have viable proof of ownership available to prove length of time animals have been owned. The official ownership date is the date shown on the bill of sale, unless the animal was bred by the exhibitor, in which case calving or birth records must be shown. Registered breeding livestock must show the exhibitor as the sole owner of the animal on the breed association papers or certificates.
- 2) No exhibitor may show an animal that has been previously sold at an auction or sale as a market animal through another fair, livestock show, whether or not there has been an actual change of ownership. Any method used to misrepresent the age of an animal for a class in which it is shown is deceptive and considered illegal. Showing an animal for another individual by claiming ownership in order to show in a specific livestock class or event is prohibited. **FALSE OWNERSHIP IS ILLEGAL**.
- 3) Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at the fair or livestock show. (Individual consideration will be given in extenuating circumstances.) Adults will not be allowed to physically assist in the preparation of the animal while at the show. Verbal instructions will be allowed, but no physical assistance is permitted. Physical assistance may be rendered by other junior aged members in good standing in the 4-H and FFA programs. Any violation will result in immediate disqualification from the show.
- 4) Treating of animals, internally or externally, with any irritant, counter-irritant or other substance used to artificially change the conformation or appearance of an animal for show is considered unethical, inhumane, and is prohibited. This includes but is not limited to the use of graphite, powders, hemp, artificial hair coloring, common products such as fly spray, ointment or liniment, used to the point that it is irritating, (unless required to reduce edema at the time of calving) or similar products. The use of dyes, spray paint, or other artificial coloring which result in altering an animal's true and natural appearance and/or color is prohibited. Adding false hair or hair-like material, fleece, or skin at any point, spot or area of the animal's body is illegal and will result in immediate disqualification. Any liquid or substance not considered part of an accepted and normal diet for livestock is deemed illegal and inhumane. For example; the use of alcoholic or carbonated beverages as a drench, filler, etc.
- 5) The use of tranquilizers, sedatives, or depressants which alter the physical or physiological state of the animal is illegal. Exceptions to this rule would be a licensed, certified veterinarian's treatment for a recognized disease or injury, or recommendation for tranquilizing breeding animals in heat that might compromise the safety of others. The drugs must be approved by the FDA for use in meat producing animals. All exhibitors shall advise show management of any drugs and/or medications administered to an animal that might be detected at the time of showing or at meat inspection. The name of the drug, its purpose, the person who administered the drug, time and date of administration, shall be presented to the show management prior to the showing and sale of the animal. Failure to report this information to the show management will result in severe penalty and/or disqualification. **Any use of drugs or substances not approved by the FDA is strictly prohibited.** All animals entered into livestock competition shall be subject to testing for foreign substances that exceed acceptable levels established by FDA, FSIS, USDA, or EPA.
- 6) Surgery, injection or insertion of foreign material under the skin and/or the flesh of an animal to change the natural contour, conformation, or appearance of an animal's body is illegal. This includes vegetable oil, silicon, or any other substance used to alter the shape of the animal. Acceptable practices of physical preparation which are allowed include clipping of hair, trimming of hooves, dehorning, or removal of ancillary teats.
- 7) The balancing of the udder by abnormal means that includes the use of a mechanical contrivance or the injection of fluid or drugs, setting the teats and/or occluding (sealing the ends with a mechanical contrivance or with the use of a chemical preparation is illegal). Treating or massaging the udder or its attachments with an irritant or counterirritant is illegal.
- 8) The use of inhumane fitting showing and/or handling practices or devices shall not be tolerated. For example, breaking of tails, striking of the animal to cause swelling or for bracing purposes, use of an electrical contrivance, or use of overly severe bits is not acceptable.

#### National Show Ring Code of Ethics Continued

- 9) Direct criticism or interference with the judge, show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited.
- 10) At the time an animal is sold at auction at the livestock show, the exhibitor shall be held directly responsible for animals that are rejected at a processing center due to the presence of foreign residues. The seller may be liable to the buyer for an amount equal to three (3) times the purchase price and may also be liable for attorney's fees and civil penalties. Show management may share acceptable intelligence and evidence information with FDA and USDA. If for any reason, any part of a meat animal carcass must be removed by the FDA or USDA inspectors, the market price will be discounted.
- 11) Show management reserves the right to require animal health certificates. Health inspections and diagnostic tests may be made before or after animals are on the livestock show premises for exhibitor and animal safety, or in the inaugurate disease control procedures which may become necessary in emergencies as determined by animal health officials.



Any violation of "The National Show Ring Code of Ethics" or specific rules as designated by individual fairs and livestock shows will result in forfeiture of premiums and awards, disqualification, and may result in probationary status and/or loss of eligibility for future participation in organized livestock competition. Possible civil penalties may be imposed by the proper authorities based on evidence provided by the livestock show of exhibitors in violation of the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act/or the animal mistreatment, neglect, and abandonment laws that apply on the local, state, and national levels.

Other cooperating shows will be notified of the action taken by show management, which may affect the eligibility of the individual, group, or sponsoring organization for participation at other shows.

#### Beef Showmanship\*

- Exhibitor must use the market animal for showmanship, if the exhibitor does not have a market animal entered in that species they may use a prospect or breeding animal that is entered. Breeding animals <u>may not</u> be a mature male breeding animal, sow or gilt over 8 months old. All breeding, market, prospect and feeding will compete in one showmanship class by age of the exhibitor. With the exception of Small Stock
  - Senior (age 14 18)
  - Junior (age 9 to 13)
  - Novice (are those members of any age that have not previously shown any small or large livestock)

#### Dairy Cattle Showmanship\*

- ➤ Senior (age 14 18 years)
- Junior (age 9 to 13)
- Novice (are those members of any age that have not previously shown any small or large livestock)

\*Champion Showman in Junior and Senior Showmanship will qualify to show in the Large Livestock Round Robin. If an individual qualifies in more than one species, they must choose one and allow the next placing individual in the show in the other species to compete.

#### **MANAGEABILITY:**

Market Beef: All beef will be weighed in and complete manageability on official scale. All members MUST be able to lead their beef to the scales, off the scales and stop their beef by themselves with absolutely no assistance. Nose rings may NOT be used. Any beef found to be unmanageable and not meeting the sifting committee's final okay will be sifted from the project at this time. \*\* Failure to attend manageability check and weigh-in will be grounds for disqualification. Veterinary verification for beef with health issues will be required to avoid disqualification

#### **ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: (ALL BEEF & DAIRY)**

- > Printed out Entry Form from ShoWorks at www.4HFFAEXPO.com, one form for each animal
- Three photos (4" x 6" maximum size) of EACH animal must be included with the entry form. Photos must clearly show the left side, right side, and face of the animal. At least one photo must include the face of the exhibitor. Side photos must show the whole side of the body, including hooves. Please write exhibitor's name, club, and scrapie ID tag number on the back of each photo.
- > Bill of Sale, or Lease Agreement for all Entries
- Arizona Brand Inspection Original Brand Inspection will be Surrendered at the Scale at Weigh-In
- > Seasonal Pass for transport to ear tagging. (Seasonal Passes will be checked, this is a Transporting Requirement)
- Current Quality Assurance certificate #
- > Entry Fee of \$10.00, payable to "Yavapai County 4-H/FFA EXPO" for each animal.
- > ALL EXPO EXHIBITORS will pay a \$25.00 clean-up fee(\*one fee per participant.) In efforts to get more help with tear-down this fee will NOT be reimbursed unless a minimum of 4 hours of tear-down hours are met.

#### **DEPARTMENT RULES**

- 1. NATIONAL Show Ring Code of Ethics will apply to this and all departments Please Read Carefully.
- 2. Exhibitors must own the animals they are showing. Breeding animals may be leased under an approved lease agreement. Proof of lease is required with entry forms.
- 3. Exhibitors must show their own animal.
- 4. Care and preparation of the animals is the responsibility of the exhibitor. (See National Show Ring Code of Ethics)
- 5. Grooming chutes must stay in designated grooming area.
- 6. All cattle must be fed and watered prior to 8:00 am and after 5:00 pm each day, including Sunday. Exhibitor must provide halter and neck rope. All stalls, pen areas and aisles must be kept clean and neat.
- 7. No bull over 1 year may be entered.

#### Yavapai Bred & Fed

- 1. The Animal being entered must have been born in Yavapai County.
- 2. The animal that birthed this animal must have been bred in Yavapai County.
- 3. Animals that are the product of artificial insemination are eligible, provided they and their mother meet the qualifications (#1 & #2)

#### <u>Division A - Dairy</u> Division Rules

- Animals may be registered or grade. Classes will be developed according to entries received. Unless otherwise stated, all breeds to compete together.
- Dairy Cattle will be classified according to the description for each breed. Dairy to dairy crosses will be permitted.
   No Dairy/Beef Crosses will be accepted.

# Division B- Breeding Division Rules

- Animals may be registered or grade. Classes will be developed according to entries received. Unless otherwise stated, all breeds to compete together.
- Cattle will be classified according to the description for each breed. Crossbred cattle will be permitted.
- Market Heifers may be entered in the Breeding Beef classes (separate fees apply).

#### <u>Division C – Market Beef</u> Division Rules

- A maximum of four Market Beef may be entered, but ONLY two can be shown. All beef must be halter broken by Manageability Check/Weigh-In. Animals deemed unsafe by the superintendent will be sifted.
- Only beef tagged by the committee will be allowed to show or sell at EXPO.
- Classes will be determined by weight and may be combined at the discretion of the superintendent at check-in and weigh-in.
- Beef with horns (whether or not they are attached to the skull), scurs, or found to be stags will be sifted. The EXPO Committee shall define Horns or Scurs.
- Beef over two years of age will be sifted.
- Market Heifers will provide verification by a veterinarian that heifer is not pregnant, issued within thirty (30) days of show, at EXPO check in.
- 7. Market Beef must be castrated prior to ear tagging or they will not be tagged.

#### <u>Division D- Prospect</u> Division Rules

- Animals deemed unsafe by the superintendent will be sifted.
- 2. Prospect Beef will not be eligible for auction and will not be tagged at entry.
- Classes will be determined by weight & may be combined at the discretion of the superintendent at checkin & weigh-in.
- Beef with horns (whether or not they are attached to the skull), scurs, or found to be stags will be sifted. The EXPO Committee shall define Horns or Scurs.
- **5.** Market beef over two years of age will be sifted.
- **6.** Prospect Beef must be castrated.
